During Pregnancy

Now, more than ever during the current COVID-19 crisis, our program can keep you connected to others and give you emotional support, education and resource referrals.

Currently provided via telephone by home visitors under nurse supervision, this program is especially valuable for mothers and families feeling isolated. A MOMS home visitor is a caring friend supporting you with knowledge about your pregnancy, healthcare, childbirth & breastfeeding. You will learn:

- How to identify signs and symptoms of preterm labor.
- The risks of diabetes during pregnancy.
- The benefits of breastfeeding.
- How to identify the signs and symptoms of depression during pregnancy and postpartum.



After Delivery

Once your baby is born, your home visitor will help you encourage your baby's health and development and provide information and resources.

Virtual Group Classes

While you are pregnant, get prepared by joining classes in childbirth, prenatal health, breastfeeding, and a workshop for new dads. Mommy & Me and My Parents & Me classes teach fun and meaningful activities that stimulate your baby's mental and physical growth while providing peer support. During the current COVID-19 crisis, we are offering these programs virtually through teleconferencing.
